Vintage Trains Open Days

VT's first Open Weekend since COVID was held in July, commemorating the Centenary of the Great Western Castle Class with a line-up of 4 examples, including *Pendennis Castle*, on loan courtesy of Didcot Railway Centre. Three were in steam.

The Friends shared a stand with Phil Dalton, a previous Chair, who offered to sell items of OO gauge rolling stock from his collection, donating 50% of takings to FoVT. Phil sold all the models, resulting in a donation of £302.50. Over the two days we raised a total of £439.48. Grateful thanks to Phil for his wonderful donation and his help over the weekend.

Developments at VT

There have been several developments at Vintage Trains. Highlights include:

- Formal opening of the Metropolitan Railway Carriage and Wagon Works at Tyseley on 20th June. The newly-built carriage shed, with 1,550 square metres of floor space, was partially funded by a grant of £168,369 from the ERDF funded Property Investment Programme awarded by Birmingham City Council. The new carriage works will employ an additional ten full time staff members.
- The first *Shakespeare Express* of 2023 ran on 16th July, with the season running through to 3rd September.
- New tours have been added to the Vintage Trains tour programme using both steam and heritage diesels. Included is a diesel explorer 'The Scarborough Belle' on 16 August, the steam hauled 'The Chester Venturer' on 14 October, a diesel explorer to Blackpool to see the illuminations on 11 November, and the steam hauled 'The Merchant Venturer' to Bath or Bristol on 5 December. The 'Polar Express' will run on selected days from 25 November. - The Tyseley guided site tours are now fully booked but keep an eye on the website in case new dates are offered.

Following our thoroughly enjoyable visit to the Electric Cinema (followed by Wetherspoon's directly opposite for lunch) on 25th May, members are invited for a second visit on **Thursday**, **5**th **October** (10.15am for 10.30am start). The Electric Cinema, the UK's oldest working cinema, is in Station Street just outside New St Station in Birmingham.

As previously, a morning of railway themed films with a BT documentary will be followed by 'The Unstoppable', a 2010 American disaster action thriller directed and produced by Tony Scott, starring Denzel Washington. Based on a real-life CSX 8888 incident, it tells the story of a runaway freight train and the attempt to stop it.

Unfortunately the trip to the Kent and East Sussex Railway in September has been cancelled but in its place we are planning a visit to the *Holdens* GWR-themed Great Western pub in Wolverhampton on **Saturday, 23rd September**. This Grade II-listed, previous CAMRA National Pub of the Year, pub is near the former low-level railway station and was sympathetically refurbished in spring 2021. No booking is required, just turn up at New Street station at 12.00 noon and meet by the main ticket office on the concourse. Trains to Wolverhampton are plentiful and don't forget your WM travel pass. We plan to arrive at the pub around 12.45pm if you wish to meet us there. This is our first pub-based social event, so do join us and other like-minded members of the Friends for an interesting trip with good food, good beer and good company.

Coming up in November we will, once again, be attending the *Warley National Model Railway Exhibition* on **25**th/**26**th **November** at the NEC, Birmingham. If you are planning to attend do pop along to our stand in Hall 5 and say hello. We will again be focussing on the restoration work the volunteers are undertaking on the Sutton Miniature Railway stock.

Tyseley Station adoption

The gardens are blooming, with recent planting sponsored by the Shakespeare Line Group and a hefty discount from Earlswood Garden Centre. The dry spell in early July placed a great demand on the small team with frequent watering being necessary.

The brickwork around each bed has been repainted in white by youngsters from The Prince's Trust, a great improvement on the previously-bare bricks. We thank West Midlands Trains for making the connection with The Prince's Trust.

A statue of Shakespeare should arrive soon, to be installed by Network Rail. All stations along the Shakespeare Line are receiving a Bard to emphasise the theme of the line, and interpreting Shakespeare's plays which, in the case of Tyseley Station, is 'All's Well That Ends Well'.



Security is being improved by West Midlands Trains with CCTV and additional locks. Since implementation, it's notable that levels of vandalism and general litter have dramatically reduced.

On the topic of gardening, work on the Tyseley Memorial Garden and picnic area is progressing with some of the artefacts found in the museum clearance and from around the site being moved into this space to form what we hope will prove to be an informative, educational and reflective place. Items such as a section of broad gauge track, an ATC ramp and the Signalman's Air Raid Shelter are included.

The Site Tour Guides are also highlighting these artefacts during their tours around the site. The tours have proved very popular and, as mentioned earlier, are now fully booked for the year.

Cards and calendars

Included is an order form for our 2024 calendar and greetings cards, all proceeds from the sale go to our funds. The theme for the calendar is 'The Shakespeare Route' with superb images of a variety of motive power through the ages, historic stations and historical snippets for each month. The front features a painting by John Austin FGRA, showing *The Cornishman* passing through Henley-in-Arden in the 1950s.

We also offer a set of 5 postcard-sized greetings cards. Each pack has 5 mixed cards each featuring a Vintage Trains locomotive; the inside is left blank for your own personal message and can be used throughout the year, not just Christmas.
