## The Friends group has re-joined the Birmingham Heritage Forum

(https://birminghamheritage.org.uk/index.html). Birmingham Heritage Forum members are organisations concerned with collections, historic sites, museums, galleries, churches, gardens and visitor services within the Birmingham area. Members meet regularly to share news and ideas, and also run workshops on issues of common concern or challenges – as an example, there is discussion about encouraging tourists from Stratford-upon-Avon to venture north to Birmingham, which could raise the profile of the Shakespeare Express both locally and within the wider tourist industry.

The Friends had a stand at the **Warley National Model Railway exhibition** at the NEC on 26 and 27 November. We shared the stand with the Sutton Miniature Railway (SMR) project which raised £550 over the weekend for the Friends and the SMR project.

**The Tyseley Station group** has been busy preparing the planters for winter following their splendid work throughout the year. For next year donations of plants would be gratefully received plus packets of wildflower seeds. New volunteers wishing to join the team would be very welcome – please use the contact details on our website with any offers of plants and/or help.

In collaboration with Vintage Trains, we propose to develop the **Tyseley picnic area**, collecting together several historical artefacts that can be found around the site. Part of this proposal would be an area for memorial plaques to those who have made an outstanding contribution to the Friends and Vintage Trains, supported by the generous donations made by our members in memory of Henry Pinchin and Peter Brown.

## There have been several developments at Vintage Trains. Highlights include:

- On Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> July 2022, Clun Castle returned to the Great Northern section of the East Coast Mainline for the first time since 1967. She hauled a special lunch train for BGL Insurance of Peterborough from their home town to Lincoln, returning down the ECML, running without a hitch
- The 2023 tour programme has been announced with several highlights, including celebrating the Centenary of the Castle Class, two Castles up the Lickey Incline on two trains on the same day, double headed Castles on the Welsh Marches Express to Hereford and a four Castle line-up at Didcot on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> March
- An expanded Shakespeare Express program for 2023
- Recently acquired Class 37 diesel No. 37 240 will make its debut on VT Explorer excursions
- The Polar Express season has been expanded this year, running from 25<sup>th</sup> November to 23<sup>rd</sup> December with unfortunate interruptions from strike days.
